PE:

- Real PE - A variety of skills based PE sessions that can be applied to a number of different sports, based on the fundamental skills of agility, balance and co-ordination.

- Rounding.

Memorable Experience -

Imagine leaving home for an unknown period of time, packing your belongings in a small box, no bigger than a shoe box. Ask children to think carefully what they would need and to bring their box of belongings into school.

Watch genuine footage of children like them being evacuated from their families. Where did they go? What did they take? How did they feel? How would you feel?

Use your skills of empathy to think and write like an evacuee!

RE:

- Describe and show understanding some relevant experiences of Moses relating this to some beliefs in the Christian Church.
- Show understanding of how for people in the church their actions are informed by their belief in the commandments.
- Engage with and respond to the question why do some people not keep some specific commandments?
- Discuss 'The Commandments are still relevant today' AT3 Or keeping the letter of commandments can actually be a bad thing.
