Telephoning school to report a child's Absence

Please be reminded that if your child is poorly and is going to be off sick from school, that you telephone us by latest 9am and choose the 'absence option' to leave a message. Please remember to do this on the morning of each day of the absence.

If your child has any Covid symptoms, such as a high temperature or a persistent cough, we would ask that you let us know and keep your child off school until they have had a test and that the result has come back. We would be grateful if you could then let us know this result and, if negative, your child can come back to school if feeling well enough to do so. Thank you.

School admissions window now open for primary and secondary school places

You can now apply for primary and secondary school places for September 2021 entry, for children starting school for the first time or for children who are moving from a primary to secondary school or from an infant to junior school.

Applications can be submitted online at www.wiltshire.gov.uk until the national deadline dates of 31 October 2020 for secondary schools and 15 January 2020 for primary schools and infant to junior transfer.

Applications to St Joseph's School should be accompanied by a Supplementary Information Form, which is needed to correctly categorise your application.

This form can be found on our website and forms part of our Admissions Policy 2020-2021. The form should be handed into school accompanied by a copy of your child's baptismal certificate BY 15th January. Supplementary Information Forms submitted after this date will not be considered during the admissions categorisation process.

Covid 19 Information—Important!

Children can get coronavirus, but they seem to get it less often than adults and it is usually less serious

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

What to do if your child has symptoms

- 1. Get a test to check if they have coronavirus as soon as possible
- 2. Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get the test results. Only leave your home to have a test
