# Covid 19 Information Important Reminders

- ⇒ To reduce the number of people on the pavements at the start of the day please can 1 adult collect and drop of at school/church gates.
- ⇒ We would appreciate it if you could wear a mask when dropping off and picking up your child, this would help support and protect the teachers/ staff on the gates.
- ⇒ Remember to keep your distance from staff, the guidance as highlighted from the DfE reminds us to stay 2 metres distance from those you do not live with, or 1 metre if wearing a mask.
- ⇒ If you would like to discuss an issue with a teacher please call, Dojo or email the school, to arrange a time to discuss or simply pass on the message. It is very difficult to have conversations at a social distance whilst maintaining privacy.
- ⇒ Remember there should be NO gatherings at pick up and drop off and you should minimise the time spent outside the home with other people.
- ⇒ Due to the no families mixing children should not be picked up/dropped off by different adults that are not in their household. If a family has a childcare arrangement with 1 other family this needs to be a consistent arrangement as part of a childcare arrangement. Please do not ask the teachers to dismiss the children to an adult that is not a household member
