"Walking in the footsteps of Jesus, loving and serving together" Remote Learning Policy 2020 -2021.

Rationale

On September 1st 2020, all our classes returned to full-time education following the Covid 19 closure in March. Although we hope that the majority of our children will now have an uninterrupted experience, there is the possibility that an individual child, a class bubble, or indeed the whole school, will need to self-isolate for a period of time. We have therefore put in place a plan for remote learning so that all children can continue with their education.

To access the home learning either click on the green Covid-19 tab on the Homepage or go to the Parents and Coronavirus tab on the school website for remote learning if and when a class bubble may need to close. See image below;

COVID 19 PANDEMIC - INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Children should **not** be at school if they have **ONE or more** of the following symptoms (as defined by the <u>NHS</u>):

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

On this page on our website will be important information regarding remote learning during absence from school along with a range of information linked to Coronavirus.

For those children who do not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support their learning. During lockdown HEALS charity of Malmesbury worked with the school to provide second hand laptops for those children who did not have a laptop. We have also made use of the DfE digital devices for those students who were eligible however, we will provide paper packs of learning for those who may, for whatever reason, need a paper pack. Parents will be reminded to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.

Role of the Teacher

The class teacher will ensure that when individuals are isolating whilst their bubble is still in school, planning specific for that child is delivered through DoJo or by email. The resources and any links will be included in the planning from your teacher.

The class teacher will ensure that the learning is accessible to all children.

In the event of a whole bubble isolating the learning will be sent by Dojo and uploaded on the website. Here you will find here an overview of lessons to be completed each day. If you click on your CLASS you will see specifically the curriculum expectations set by your class teacher.

It will provide learning across the curriculum and children will be expected to spend a similar amount of time completing this as they would spend learning in school.

Each week the class teacher will arrange an online session and will keep in touch with each family/child fortnightly.

Teachers will also have designated children that they need to monitor and feed back to the DSL/DDSL that calls have taken place in accordance to the agreed time frequency.

Teachers will keep a record of the learning completed by children and feedback to pupils learning via DoJo or email.

Role of the Curriculum Leader

The Curriculum leader will ensure that during any bubble lockdowns, the coverage for their subject area is consistently applied to planning and resources sent out by teachers.

The Curriculum Leaders will feedback and support teachers to ensure they have the resources necessary to carry out the remote learning in their Curriculum area.

The Core Curriculum Leaders will produce feedback to the Headteacher in the form of a report to outline their monitoring and support during a bubble lockdown.

Role of the SENCO

The SENCO will monitor that learning is accessible for children and provide support and feedback to the teachers to ensure that children have work that is at the correct level for their learning.

The SENCO will produce feedback to the Headteacher in the form of a report to outline the monitoring carried out by the SENCO and the support provided to teachers during a bubble lockdown.

Role of the Parent

As a school we want to support your child and your family whilst you are isolating. There is an expectation that pupils are asked to continue with their learning during isolation so they do not experience any further breaks/gaps in their education.

Pupils are encouraged to send any completed work to teachers via the school Dojo/email. Alternatively, work that children complete on paper should be kept safe and returned to school when safe to do so.

Parents will be reminded to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.

Parents are able to contact the teacher through Dojo email and the school via telephone or the school admin email address.

Pupils identified as vulnerable will be contacted by the Class teacher on a weekly basis and support offered as necessary. The class teacher will liaise with the DSL/DDSL.

The Oak National Academy.

The 'teaching content' will be provided to children through age appropriate video content on the DfE published list of educational resources site; Oak National Academy website. This provides the equivalent of 3 hours of lessons per day for primary school children. In their 'classroom' each lesson is an hour-long. They're delivered by a teacher, with a pre-recorded video as well as quizzes, worksheets and creative activities.'

Data protection

When accessing personal data, all staff members will: Only use their official school email account and connect to the school network using their issued school laptop alone.

Sharing personal data
