Unfortunately, due to Covid 19 and the return to lockdown, the National Children's Measurement Programme (NCMP) which involves year 6 and Reception class children and the hearing and vision screening for Reception children are not able to be carried out at present.

Remote Learning

Remote learning will be provided for all children during the lockdown period. We have provided a full programme since Tuesday 5th January. This incorporates a blended programme of remote learning accessible on the school website/through DoJo, live lessons and recorded sessions. We have provided 3+ hours for EYFS and Key stage 1 and 4+ hours for Key stage 2.

PLEASE remember we would like the children to engage with the provision, but as all families are in different situations and have different commitments you must do what works for you. If you need to prioritise we recommend the core subjects such as, English, Maths and RE. Remember it is important to encourage children to take part in activities they enjoy, such as building a Lego house, baking a cake or making a den in the garden. This will help with their well-being, enjoyment and engagement levels.
