They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend	Please take a moment to check your child's head for headlice over the holiday and treat as required. We have had reports of Headlice in St Lawrence Class.
Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.	The school holiday is a good opportunity to break the head lice cycle and we can all return head lice free for Term 5.
