Late Arrivals

We are seeing a number of children persistently arriving late to school. When pupils arrive late they miss out on essential instructions given at the beginning of the lesson. This can significantly reduce achievement. Your child may also feel awkward arriving to the classroom when everyone else is settled. Furthermore, when one pupil arrives late it disrupts the entire class.

The school gates close at 8.50am, registration is taken at 8.55am and closes at 9.20am. Arrival after 8.55am results in a Late mark on the register, arrival after the register closes results in an Unauthorised mark. Children arriving late will need to be noted in the late book in the office with a reason for the lateness and time of arrival.

This school year Art and Design has been at the forefront of our creative curriculum, with our 90th celebration commemorative plates where each student had the opportunity to learn about creative design and implement their own ideas on a plate, and more recently, with Ukrainian artist Nataliia Gerasymchuk giving a whole school assembly and talking to the children about what her art means to her.
