Sunday's Gospel highlights the difference between good actions and good intentions. Jesus is talking to chief priests and elders who may well have preached to others about how to live a good life without listening to their own advice. It is often easy to 'say' the right thing but can be very difficult to 'do' it. During Gospel assembly the children reflected on how 'actions speak louder than words' and how they can show 'love' for others through their actions

The children had a wonderful experience on Monday working with a local artist, their behaviour was impeccable and their artistic skills shone.

Thank you to the parents that came into school this week to see phonics in action in St. Teresa's, find out from the class teachers what is happening in the class this year during the teacher/parent sessions and those that joined us in celebration assembly today.

October is the month dedicated to the Rosary. Saturday 7th October is the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary.

Praying the Rosary

The Rosary is a meditative prayer that reflects upon the life, ministry, and death of Jesus and also on His Blessed Mother. As we repeat the familiar prayers, we allow our minds to think about the lives of Jesus and Mary here on earth – a mystery.

There are four parts to the rosary, known as 'mysteries':

The Luminous Mysteries
The Sorrowful Mysteries
The Glorious Mysteries
The Joyful Mysteries

The prayers we say as part of this set begin with one **Our Father**, followed by **ten Hail Marys** and one **Glory Be** to finish. We use the beads of the Rosary to keep track of our prayers! The children may bring in a rosary from home each day for the next two weeks and they will have an opportunity to pray the rosary in class.

Gabriella - "I loved learning Roman numerals in Maths; I just really like them!!!"








Playground Fun!

Will – "The trip was very fun and exhilarating, I enjoyed how people see the abbey in different ways."


Eva – "The trip was very fun, we had a whole morning of exploring art and practising skills."


Alisia – "I liked the art morning because we don't get to do art very often and I like getting to draw the abbey."
