

#### Safer Internet week

This week there has been a spotlight on how to use the internet safely.

The children have been thinking and learning about 'Inspiring change - Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online'.

As parents it can be challenging to navigate the online world and be aware of the potential pitfalls and dangers. To support you in making informed decisions we have included this week information on minimum age requirements and safe search engines for children.

**CEOP** say:

Minimum age requirements

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#### Minimum age requirements

Most of the popular social media services require users to be at least 13 years of age before they can register, although some sites are created especially for children under 13 (see Internet Matters' <u>Social networks made for children</u>).

The age requirements are there because of data protection laws. Online services are not allowed to collect or store children's personal information if they are under the age of 13. Data protection laws also say that only children aged 13 and over can sign up to online services without parental permission. Following the age restrictions sets a good example for your child. Although the age requirement doesn't always mean the site is inappropriate for children to use, it's a good indication, especially for younger children.



# Safe search engines



Kiddle https://www.kiddle.co/

Ages: 4+

<u>Kiddle</u> is a safe, visual search engine for children powered by Google. The first three results to each query are child-safe sites and pages written specifically for children and hand-picked by the editors at Kiddle. Results 4-7 are also hand-picked by the editors, and include safe, trusted sites that are not specifically written for children, but have simple, easy-to-understand content. Finally, all the following results are written for adults, but filtered by Google safe search. This site can also be used to search for images safely.

### Swiggle - https://swiggle.org.uk/ -



Swiggle is a search engine designed to provide a safer environment for kids taking their first steps on the road to safe online searching. Powered by Google Custom Search, the results are filtered using Google SafeSearch and educational resources prioritised. We also filter the search terms to check that Swiggle is not being used to search for inappropriate content. This site can also be used to search for images safely.

Another safe search engine that can also be used to search webites, images and videos.

Jenson – "I enjoyed decimals in maths because it's fun".


Alex – "I liked the computer safety lesson and exploring how technology will be in the future'.
