<u>Children helping children – Little Red Box Scheme</u>

We are keeping our collection open for the Mission Together charity for another week. If your child would still like to bring in the little red box that was sent home to enable them to take part in collecting contributions, then these can still be handed into the office until the end of next week. Whatever you are able to collect will be greatly appreciated! Thank you in advance for your generosity. So far we have raised £42.65 through theses collection boxes.



Mission Together is the Catholic Church's official children's charity for overseas mission. For almost 200 years, <u>Missio</u> has been providing overseas missionaries with the support they need to build and sustain faith communities in areas of poverty and conflict. Our famous Red Box encourages Catholic families in England and Wales to give what they can to help these communities materially and spiritually.

On-line Safety

At the start of last term we had a focus on Safer Internet Day and continue to have ongoing lessons to help children understand their choices when using the internet for entertainment, learning and communication. As a school we are also aware of the Children's Commissioner's recent report on <u>Digital Childhoods</u> which recognised the advantages of digital technology at the same time as highlighting issues for children's mental health and safety in a digital world. Her views around risks are certainly things we share and consequently we do all we can to inform children of risks, in an age appropriate way, along with having our own safeguarding measures. These measures include, filtering through the South West Grid for learning, monitoring of all users through our IT provider and through school policy (Online safety, Acceptable Use, <u>Use of Mobile technology</u>).

We also recognise that children's access and use of technology can present parents with dilemmas along with recognising that keeping up with technological advances can be both confusing and challenging. For this reason, we were very interested to hear about the group that Mrs Winram-Crump is trying to establish within and across our community (see below). This specifically focuses on children's access to technology through mobile devices and aims to help parents have sensible alternatives to Smart Phones. As children's use of mobile technology was a particular issue raised by the Children's Commissioner, and is also something we experience as impacting on children's relationships, we feel her initiative is certainly something that we can signpost to all parents. We hope that this group is something other parents might find useful as they navigate children's growing maturity and the pressures and dilemmas this can pose.

Malmesbury Smartphone-Free-Childhood

Would you like to join a what's app group with other carers who want to create a realistic choice for NOT giving their child a smartphone? If so please text 07786 961249 to be added to the group!

This newly formed group will do this by:

- 1. Allowing carers to see that other families may share concerns or worries about mobile technology;
- 2. Reassuring carers their child won't be the 'odd one out' at secondary school and reduce peer pressure;
- 3. Share useful info e.g. alternative phones and communication technology, e.g. new studies /info re impact of smartphones on kids' mental health.

There might also be discussions about other initiatives people want to take to share the message. e.g. school or community group based initiatives.

Please note: This is NOT a "no-phones /no-screens thing" - it's about sensible approaches to Smart phones and other technologies to safeguard children's health and wellbeing in the digital world (web access, social media and online forums/communications).

On-street parking at drop-off and pick-up

As a school we have no jurisdiction with respect to enforcing parking regulations and recognise that where parents choose to park is their own choice and responsibility. We have, however, had several complaints from other road users and those in the

locality about unsafe and inconvenient parking. This is particularly on double yellow lines on and around the bend at the top of The Holloway.

We are therefore requesting that, unless there is a very specific reason that would be supported by the



Highway Code, parents always use the Cross Hayes carpark or park a distance from the school and "Park and Stride" to drop-off and pick-up.

We work hard to keep positive relationship with all our neighbours, who naturally blame us for parking that is inconsiderate or dangerous. We thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation.
