
As with last year we aim to use our newsletter to bring you up to speed with the events that have happened over the last week and also things to look forward to in the near future.

When Miss Bathe and I joined the school last year we highlighted that parents are welcome to come onto the school site at both the start and end of the day. This will give you the chance to settle your children and pass on quick messages to school staff. Please, please do not feel you have to just drop at the gate and go. As with last year we also hold a celebration worship every Friday that all parents are welcome to attend. This starts at 14:45 and is an informal, but celebratory, end to the school week.

Meet the teacher:

Now that the children are settled in their new classes we will be holding a short "Meet your child's class teacher" drop in next Thursday12th September between 15:30 and 15:45. This is not a formal meeting but will provide you with an opportunity to say hello to your child's class teacher, hear about any specific classroom arrangements and ask any questions you may have. This is not, however, a time to discuss individual children. Should you wish to do this, you can make an appointment at this time or do this through the school office.

For the children in St Scholastica, there will be a short update meeting after this to clarify any additional arrangements for their forthcoming residential.

Sad news:

We are very sorry to report that unfortunately Mrs Bradley's husband became very ill over the summer holiday and unfortunately she has been unable to start the school year. We hope this is only going to be a short term absence. In the interim, Mrs Cambray-Smith will be covering her absence on Thursday and we have a recommended supply teacher Mr Parish, covering the Friday.

Our thoughts and prayers are with Mrs Bradley and we ask for your understanding at this uncertain time for her and her family.

Parent governors:

Our Interim Executive Board is now in a position to begin the process of converting to a conventional governing body and is holding elections for two parent governors. This is a key role in the life of the school. Please see the letter and application form which has been sent via Parentpay. The deadline is midday on Friday, 20th September at midday and the first meeting is likely to be on Tuesday, 22nd October.

For clarity, parent governors do not have to be experts in education. What they do bring however is the perspective of a typical parent to the governing body. Their role is fundamentally strategic and does not involve activities linked to the operational running of the school. Parent governors serve for four years, which can continue to the end of their term even if they no longer have children in school. All governor activity is confidential and must not be shared outside the governing body. Governors are volunteers and, while demanding, it is a rewarding role.



We are now taking enquiries for children who will be in Yr 3 or above, from Sept 24, regarding 2025 First Holy Communion preparation.

This will happen term time weekly on **Sundays after 10am Mass, from 12th January 2025**; the day and time also best accommodates the provision of altar serving training, (by Remi). Parents will be required to attend some sessions and assist catechists on a rota basis For those who have not yet registered, applications are to be received by **Friday 18th October 24**.

On Sunday 24th November 24, Solemnity of Christ the King, ('Youth Sunday'), 10am Mass will be animated by children of the parish, giving an opportunity for children FHC candidates, to see how they can take part in future similar Masses. Following that Mass, we'll move to the town hall, to have a parents meeting and registration 'stations', followed by a light welcome lunch, with Fr Thomas and catechists, as an opportunity to socialise and address any other concerns.

Children candidates and siblings will be supervised and catered for in the same space, in a separate group.
