### Headteachers' message

Dear parents and carers,

It was good to see you all at this week's Parent / Teacher meetings and I hope these were helpful and productive for you. If you were unable to keep your appointment, please get in contact with your child's class teacher and arrange an alternative time.

There has been business across the school this week that started with a remembrance Mass on Monday, antibullying activities across the week to mark Anti Bullying week, visits to the church in Year 3 and 4 and lastly good deeds across Malmesbury in St Teresa's Class.

#### **Remembrance Mass:**

Our first Mass of the year was held in St Aldhelms Church on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> November. The focus of this mass was an opportunity to consider how all of us can be ambassadors of "The Word" through our words and actions. Through this, Father Shalbin suggested that acts of love and kindness could help stop conflict and unnecessary harm. The mass was supported by all members of our Chaplaincy Team who either read or contributed to ritual acts within the service.

My special thanks go to Father Shalbin for leading the Mass and to Mrs Chambray-Smith who coordinated readings, prayers and the singing. Please feel free to read some of the bidding prayers from the mass in the hall if you join us for Celebration worship today.

### **Anti-Bullying week:**

The other whole school event this week was our focus on Anti-bullying Week. This year's theme was to treat others with respect and began on Tuesday with an invitation to join the rest of the country by wearing odd socks to school. The symbolic purpose of this was to recognise that although socks (and us) are all the same, all are also different. The Anti Bullying Alliance, who coordinate Anti Bullying Week in the UK, have a good summary video on their website that may help contextualise why having this focus is important to all of us, adults included – Respect: What will you choose?

return to the school office by Friday 22nd November. We do now have a supply of new school ties, please contact the office if you need one.






