

Scripture summarised

The readings highlight Jesus' threefold coming: as Redeemer in the flesh, at the end of time or our death to complete salvation, and daily in our lives as we live out Christian love.

The first reading from Daniel, written to comfort persecuted Jews, calls us to live wisely in the present. The Psalm reminds us, "You are my inheritance, O Lord," affirming faith. In Hebrews, we are urged to hope, knowing Jesus mediates for us at God's right hand. The Gospel c ffers hope to persecuted early Christians, urging readiness for Jesus' return as Judge, since we cannot know "the day or the hour.







Pilgrimage Walk

All are welcome: Pilgrim Cross began as a Catholic student pilgrimage 75 years ago but has evolved into an ecumenical endeavour. We have a long history of welcoming people of other Christian traditions; and you are equally welcome if you are of another faith or none.

Fellowship: walking, singing, praying, eating and sharing accommodation together for a week is an amazing experience of living in Christian Community.

Prayer: we enjoy times of silence, prayer, singing and mass throughout this Holy Week.

Pilgrimage distance, route & terrain: setting off from Oxford City Centre we walk between 10 and 17 miles (that's 16-27k) per day and a total of 104 miles over 7 days arriving in Walsingham on Good Friday. The route is very scenic and fairly flat. It comprises a mixture of quiet & busy roads, country lanes & footpaths and the occasional field (which can be muddy/ slippery). We walk through some beautiful villages and through Norwich City (where we stop to visit both the Anglican and Catholic Cathedrals). There are refreshment and lunch-stops at intervals along the way (including excellent home-made cake kindly provided by local parishes)!

Fitness: you will need a reasonable level of physical fitness to meet the challenge of this particular leg. You should be confident that you can walk the daily mileage and have a certain amount of upper body strength since pilgrims take it in turns, in teams of 3, to carry our large wooden cross – something you will come to love! So, some pre-pilgrimage training is advised but well worth it! If this seems like too much for you, do check out one of our other legs on the PX website.

Amazing Value: students/unwaged £75; low waged £125; fully waged £210 - this covers all food, a mid-week transfer from Oxfordshire to Norfolk, and accommodation for 8 days.

Support: expect to be well supported, meet like-minded people and make new friends.

Chaplaincy: the Oxford Leg is supported by a Jesuit priest within the team.

Easter Liturgies: and we celebrate the triduum together in Walsingham at the Catholic Church and Anglican Shrine.

Accommodation: it will feel a bit like camping for the first 8 nights (sleeping bags in church halls), then comparative luxury of the Pilgrim Bureau in Walsingham (with beds & showers) for the last 2 nights.

Bursaries: are available to help with cost and equipment (walking boots/ sleeping bags/ air beds etc).

Journeys home on Easter Sunday: coaches will run from Walsingham to Leicester and to London around 3pm in the afternoon. This is an additional £25 cash charge.
