



Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Aldhelm's,

We hope you are ok wherever you are. We are delighted to be in touch with you through this newsletter.

We extend a warm welcome to all visitors and thank you for joining us in celebrating the Lord's love for us in the Holy Eucharist. There are no strangers here, just new friends you have not yet met!

Readings Summarised

The first reading describes the Jewish ritual of presenting first fruits during the harvest festival to thank God for His deliverance and strength. The Responsorial Psalm (Ps 91) reflects Satan's temptation of Jesus in the desert. In the second reading, St. Paul urges early Christians not to retu n to Jewish laws but to embrace salvation through the risen Jesus. Scholars believe the temptations of Jesus in the Gospels represent His inner struggle against temptations throughout His life. The devil sought to stop Jesus from fulfilling His mission of saving humanity through sacrifice, tempting H m to misuse His power and avoid suffering.

Contactless card machine in porch

A few parishioners have reported problems with the contactless machine. We contacted the Dona people. They replied that there was an issue that occurred with our digital collection plate (DCP). It appears that from 26th January to 1st March, the device was operating in offline mode, meaning; that any donations made during this period were stored but not immediately processed.

When the DCP reconnected to the internet on 1st March, all previously stored donations were synced and processed at once. As a result, some donors may have noticed multiple charges on their bank accounts. They assured us that these are not duplicate payments but rather donations made earlier that had not yet been collected. The system is now operating correctly, and all future donations should be processed in real time. If you are still experiencing any issues, please do not hesitate to contact Tony or Sheila, who will be happy to assist you.

Spiritual Adoption

The Spiritual Adoption is a powerful prayer for those children who are in danger of death in the womb of their mothers. The Adoption starts with the oath taken in church usually on (or close tc) Annunciation Day and lasts for nine months till Christmas. In this time you say one decade of the Rosary each day and a daily prayer for your adopted child. You can also decide to do some extra spiritual exercise or an additional resolution, but this is optional.

We do not know who our child is or where she or he might live. Only God knows his or her nam a. (You can give your child a name of your choice though, so that you feel closer.) Everyone can adc pt a child - men and women of every walk of life, even children - providing they are mature enough to keep praying for 9 months.

The Spiritual Adoption has started in our parish three years ago and we would like to keep up the good work. This year we will take the oath on 23rd March at 10.00 Mass. 


