

Readings this week

This sunday's readings highlight the call to follow Jesus, the Good Shepherd, even through rejection and suffering, as Paul and Barnabas did. Their mission to the Gentiles marked a turning point in the early Church's relationship with Judaism. Revelation presents Jesus as both the Lamb and Shepherd, offering hope of eternal life to all who remain faith ul. The Gospel reassures us that no one can take us from the Father's hands, while also challenging both pastors and lay faithful to live their vocations faithfully—pastors as good shepherds, and the people as trusting, responsive sheep in the care of God.

What joy fills our hearts as we welcome the news that Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost has been elected Pope, taking the name Leo XIV! God never ceases to care for His faithful—He never leaves us orphaned. In a world longing for peace, healing, and clarity, the Lord has given us a shepherd after His own heart. This fund enables the Bishop to fund their training at seminary and offer them a grant during their years of formation. The fund, at times, is also used to support the on-going formation opportunities for clergy in our Diocese and formation of permanent Deacons.

Visitation 2025

On 13 October 1917, God worked a spectacular miracle of the sun in Fatima, Portugal to prove that our Blessed Lady was appearing to the three little shepherd children,

Jacinta, Francisco and Lucia, with an important message for our time. This miracle was witnessed by some 70,000 people including government officials and newspaper reporters, all of whom testified that it actually happened.

Next month, On the 7th and 8th of June 2025, The World Apostolate of Fatima-England and Wales is bringing to our parish the National Pilgrim Virgin Statue, as approved by the Arch/Bishop.

This beautiful statue of Our Lady of Fatima was blessed by Pope St Paul VI and giver to our country by the Bishop of Fatima in 1968 to commemorate the Golden Jubilee of the apparitions and to make known the important message of Fatima.

Pope St John Paul II said the Fatima message "is the true Gospel of Christ presented anew to our generation… Let us receive the light that comes from Fatima, let us be guided by Mary."



Dear Parishioner

I am writing to you about something that lies close to my heart and, I believe, close to the heart of the Church: the future of Catholic education in our Diocese.

Catholic schools have been a beacon of light in this country since as early as 600 A.D., first founded by monastic communities as places of learning, formation, and faith. After the restoration of the Catholic hierarchy in 1850, the bishops of England and Wales articulated a vision to prefer the establishment of good schools before churches. That vision has borne great fruit over generations.

Here in the Diocese of Clifton, we are blessed with over 60 schools - many of them built with the hard work and sacrifice of Catholic immigrant communities. Today, those schools continue to serve thousands of young people, supported by dedicated headteachers and a quiet army of volunteer governors and directors who offer their time, energy, and love in service of our children.

But the future of our schools now stands at a crossroads.

At present, there are around 100 vacancies for Foundation Governors and Directors across our Diocese. Without these essential roles, the mission of our schools, and the Catholic ethos that makes them so special, is at risk.

And so, I tum to you with a heartfelt invitation: might you consider becoming a Foundation Governor of one of our Catholic schools, or a Foundation Director within one of our three Catholic Educational Trusts?

To echo the words of the late Cardinal Basil Hume: "To be a governor of a Catholic school is to be involved in the mission of the Church." And what a beautiful mission it is to help shape young minds and hearts, to offer them not just knowledge but wisdom, not just skills but purpose, not just education but an encounter with Christ.

The role of a Foundation Governor or Director is, in essence, to be a witness, to help ensure that our schools remain places where Christ is known and loved, where the dignity of every child is cherished, and where Catholic values infuse the curriculum, the culture, and the community.

As St. Gregory the Great once said, "The love of Christ is not rested until it works to shape the hearts of others." Your time and talents could do just that for the next generation.

You don't need to be an expert in education - just a practising Catholic, aged over 18, who is willing to serve. People from all backgrounds are warmly welcomed, and full training and support are provided. The time commitment varies from school to school but averages out at less than one hour a week.

If you, or someone you know, has benefitted from a Catholic education, this may be a chance to give back to continue the legacy and renew the mission.
