

Readings this week

Today's readings highlight the transforming presence of God in the Church and in each believer. In Acts, the Holy Spirit guides the apostles to resolve a critical issue regarding Gentile converts, preserving unity in the early Church. The Psalm calls all nations to recognise and praise God. Revelation presents the Church as the New Jerusalem, where God dwells with His people in love through the risen Christ. In the Gospel, Jesus promises the Holy Spirit as our Advocate, Teacher, and Source of peace. This presence brings guidance, joy, and hope to all who follow Christ.

The event will take place on Monday, 10th June, with two convenient time slots available: 2:00 FM or 7:00 PM.


