



Solemnity of SS Peter and Paul

Peter, a fisherman from Bethsaida and brother of Andrew, was introduced to Jesus by Andrew. Jesus renamed him Cephas (Peter) and made him the leader of the apostles. At Caesarea Philippi, Jesus promised to make Peter the heac of the Church—a role confirmed after the Resurrection. Instituted by the Holy Spirit, Peter proclaimed the Good News at Pentecost, began missionary work, and presided over the first Council of Jerusalem. He wrote two epistles and was martyred under Nero.

Paul, originally Saul, was a Roman citizen from Tarsus, tra ned as a tent-maker and educated under Rabbi Gamaliel. A zealous Pharisee, he persecuted Christians before his dramatic conversion on the road to Damascus. He becam at the great missionary to the Gentiles, founding churches, writing 14 epistles, and suffering imprisonment before being martyred in Rome. May we imitate their apostolic zeal.

The Collection derives its name from an ancient custom. In the ninth-century, King Alfred the Great collected money – "pence" or pennies – from landowners as financial support for the Pope. Today, the Peter's Pence Collection supports the Pope's philanthropy by giving the Holy Father the means to provide emergency assistance to those in need because of natural disaster, war, oppression and disease.

Carlo Acutis to be canonised on 7 September

Pope Leo XIV held the first Ordinary Public Consistory of his pontificate on Friday morning, 13 June, with Cardinals giving their formal approval for the canonisations of eight Blesseds.

During the ceremony, the Holy Father announced that London-born Blessed Carlo Acutis will be canonised on 7 September alongside Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati.

The canonisations of the two young saints – one from the early twentieth century, the other the first millennial saint – have been greatly anticipated due to the great devotion among the faithful.





Saturday 12th July at 11.00am – Jubilee Mass & Reception




