Readings this Sunday

This Sunday's readings highlight the power and nature of prayer. In Genesis, Abraham models intercessory prayer through persistent and humble dialogue with God, showing that God's mercy responds to the goodness of even a few. The Psalm echoes this with a song of trust: "Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me," affirming God's closeness to the humble. Paul, in Colossians, reminds us that our faith in Christ—who gave us new life through His death and resurrection—grounds all Christian prayer. The Gospel then presents Jesus teaching the Lord's Prayer, encouraging us to pray with boldness, trust, and perseverance. Like Abraham and the persistent friend in the parable, we are urged to approach Gc d confidently, knowing He listens and responds with generosity. These readings invite us into deeper trust and persistence in our relationship with God through prayer.

Jim Westman RIP





We also take this occasion to extend our heartfelt thanks to Ann, who wonderfully and faithfully looks after our garden all year long.




First Holy Communion – June 2026


