

#### **Readings this Sunday**

Today's readings highlight the importance of hospit ality and listening to God. In the first reading, Abraham and Sarah welcome three strangers, who are angels, and are rewarded with the promise of a son. The Psalm reminds us that those who act justly will live in God's presence. Paul, in the second reading, speaks of his mission to proclaim the mystery of Christ and urges believers to be open and welcoming. In the Gospel, Martha busies herself serving Jesus, while Mary listens attentively to him. Jesus affirms Mary's choice, teaching that prayerful listening must precede active service. We are called to combine Martha's service with Mary's contemplation, welcoming Christ into our hearts so we can serve others with love and purpose.

- -£100 gifted by religious sisters who joined us for Sunday's celebration.
- -A wedding party kindly contributed £100.
- -And just recently, another £1,000 donation has been received.

This brings the total of these recent gifts to £2,347.

#### SECOND COLLECTION BISHOP'S CHARITABLE FUND, 27 July 2025

The annual collection for the Bishop's Charitable Fund enables the Bishop to respond to the many charitable causes that appeal to him. This money, in a way, is 'us' reaching out to the little causes we never hear about. It enables the Bishop to be charitable on behalf of the Diocese and to respond both immediately and at his discretion to those who seek his help.

## **New Hall Update**

We now have conditional approval from the Bishop to build our new hall, subject to fulfilling certain conditions. One of these was to clarify the VAT position, and we're pleased to say we've now received confirmation from HMRC that VAT will not be payable on the hall, so that's one important item ticked off.

The next step is to agree a revised price with the contractor. Progress here is positive, though not yet complete.

We also continue to raise the remaining funds through our parish fundraising and grant application efforts, led by Bernadette and Gabrielle. You'll be pleased to know we received £9,000 this week, an encouraging boost.

The committee is very grateful to all parishioners for your continued support and generosity. Please keep up the good work!

It is with great sadness that we share the news that Jim passed away peacefully this




