#### Head Teacher's message

Dear Parents, Carers,

It seems hard to believe we are at the end of our first term already and starting to prepare for Term 2. It has been a very actioned pack end to this term with successes in rugby and netball for the school from a sports perspective and an amazing response from you all for our Harvest Festival Celebrations (see Page 2).

As we approach Term 2, please read on for updates from the last two weeks and also to get a picture of things we are planning for the future. We hope that you all have a restful October break and look forward to seeing you again at the start of November.

## Worship this Term

For the whole of this term we have had a focus on the school's value of Serving and Giving and the Catholic Social Teaching element linked to "Options for the Poor". With a strong focus over the last two weeks on Harvest we have used two stories to illustrate the importance of unconditional giving, the first was the Rainbow Fish by Marcus Pfister and the second was a Chinese parable about how working together for the good of others can bring happiness to all. Worship for next term will focus on the virtue of Peace and our Catholic Social Teaching focus will be Family and Community. Both of these elements will lead us into the season of Advent.

#### Head Teacher work patterns for Term 2

As outlined at the start of the year, Mrs Carpenter and I are operating a co-headship for this year. This means we are sharing the role of headteacher on the days when we are in school. This arrangement is very similar to the organisation when Miss Bathe and I shared the role. What is slightly different, however, is our work pattern which fluctuates across the term and has been designed to allow us to both experience the start and end of the week, rather than having a set day working pattern. What this means is that we alternate who works on the Monday and Tuesday and Thursday and Friday. This is summarised as follows for the next term
