

Readings this Sunday

The readings present Faith as trust in God, hope ir

suffering, and steadfast loyalty to His Covenant. The prophet affirms that Faith gives access to Divine power, enabling the just to live righteously amid evil. The Psalm praises God as Rock and Shepherd, worthy of trust. Paul describes Faith as acceptance of Jesus, fulfilment of God's promises, and stresses living fidelity to Christ's teaching handed on through the Church. Faith is belief in revealed truth grounded in God's authority; Hope is trust in Him. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches that even a little genuine Faith allov/s God to work wonders. What matters is not the quantity but the quality of our Faith. Through the master–servant parable, Jesus shows that true Fa th must be joined to obedience, commitment, and readiness to serve God's will wholeheartedly.

School for Synodality UK invites! - the Final Document of the Synod Assembly was wide ranging and inspirational, and it's time to progress to the next steps at grass-rcots level as we seek to embed synodality in our everyday Catholic life and culture. In June 2025, the Vatican released a guiding document called Pathways for the Implementation Phase of the Synod. This highlighted some key areas of focus: such as widening the interest and investment in synodality, finding more effective ways to listen to those on the margins, and reflecting on the rapidly changing nature of parish life. Bishop Bosco is keen for Clifton Diocese to engage fully with the implementation phase, and we are encouraged to join the School for Synodality live on Saturday 18th October to explore all this and more, with prayer, small group sharing, testimony, and keynote speaker Bishop Brendan Leahy of the Limerick Diocese in Ireland. As ever, when the School for Synodality community gathers, there will be plenty to challenge and inspire us. Come Holy Spirit!

Starting School? If you have a child born between 1 September 2021 and 31 August 2022, then now is the time to apply for a place at a primary school for admission from September 2026 onwards. You must complete an application form that is available from the school admissions team of the Wiltshire Council. If your child has been baptised and you are applying for a Catholic school, you must also provide a copy of the baptism certificate to the school. Please ensure you apply by the closing date of 15 January 2026.

Avarice
